Application

We are glad you are considering applying to a Bachelor's or Master's programme at Uppsala University. The application period is open from mid-October to mid-January.

Applications are submitted through the Swedish national application portal, University Admissions. There you can create an account, search for programmes and courses, complete your application, upload supporting documents, pay the application fee (if required), and track the status of your application.

Tuition fee

If you are a student from outside the EU, EEA, or Switzerland, you will need to pay a tuition fee. Depending on the programme, one semester of full-time study costs between 50,000 and 90,000 SEK. You can find the exact fee for each programme in the online programme catalogue.

The tuition fee covers studies amounting to 30 credits per semester. It does not include other costs related to admission or studying at Uppsala University, such as accommodation, meals, or study materials. If you wish to register for additional courses, you will need to pay for these separately.

Scholarships

Uppsala University offers scholarships for newly admitted students who pay tuition fees. Selection is based on academic merit and a motivational letter, not financial need, and competition is high. Your academic performance is assessed using the documents you submit when applying for a Bachelor's or Master's programme through universityadmissions.se.

Scholarship selection runs alongside the programme admission process, and you will receive both results at approximately the same time.

International students may also explore additional funding opportunities through the Swedish Institute. To discover all opportunities, visit uu.se/scholarships.

Entry requirements

To be eligible for Master's studies at Uppsala University, you must hold a Bachelor's degree from an internationally recognised university, equivalent to a Swedish Kandidatexamen (typically four years of study).

You must also demonstrate English proficiency, usually equivalent to the Swedish upper secondary course English 6, proven through a recognised test such as TOEFL or IELTS. If you have questions about your application or entry requirements, contact our Applicant Support team at study@uu.se. We strongly recommend seeking guidance and submitting the correct documents from the start to avoid delays.

Most Master's programmes also have specific requirements, usually a certain number of credits in relevant subjects from previous studies. These are assessed by the programme's department, typically upon application.

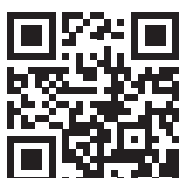
